Mirza Ghalib College (MGC), a Deficit grant Post Graduate Minority College affiliated to Magadh University, Bodh-Gaya, was established in 1969, in the centenary year of a great Urdu and Persian poet Mirza Asadullan Khan Ghalib, with an aim to impart value-based quality education to students. The impetus for its setting up came primarily from two important reasons; at the regional level of the undivided Bihar back in the 1960s, there was lack of educational facilities for the minority students especially female students with an easy and safe access to education, and secondly the Constitutional provisions of Articles 29 and 30 gave encouragement to its founding members to launch a learning centre which could facilitate education and research on the models of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan. The College draws a lot of its inspiration from the contributions of the legendary Sir Syed in the field of education, knowledge culture, and scientific outlook. The College aims at educating young minds to develop to their full natural potential and also transforming them into emotionally sound, socially responsible, and morally upright citizens. The establishment of the College was marked by a belief in knowledge based social transformation, with accessible and affordable quality education to all especially the socially and the economically deprived section of the society. MGC has the credit of being the first minority college of the undivided Bihar to start post graduate teaching which was inaugurated by the then Chief Minister of Bihar Sri Lalu Prasad Yadav on 5h October 1994. Marching ahead with innovative ideas and adding to its legacy new developments each year, MGC has come along a long way transforming and evolving itself into a premier learning institution with students' support, teachers' strength and governing body's encouragement. Moving in tandem with the changing technological needs of current time, College has switched to 'cashless transaction' in its admission procedure in the year 2021 making it hassle-free for students and promoting environmental sustainability. MGC is accredited with grade B by NAAC in the year 2018 in its first cycle of assessment.

Since the beginning, MGC has been offering various UG and PG level courses, inspiring and shaping young students to lead and excel in various academic, corporate and professional domains. In addition to conventional courses, Vocational courses in Computer Application, Business Management and Bio-

Technology Honours (BCA, BBM & Bio-Tech) are also being run successfully at UG level for the last 16 years. These vocational courses have taken many students to the heights of their career life. Some of the alumni from the vocational departments have made to top-ranking corporate positions. The College has won several sports accolades and trophies leaving indelible imprints of its vibrant and energetic athletic spirits at the regional and state level. Over the last few years, the College has been able to promote its research activities in the faculties of sciences, social sciences, and Arts & Humanities with the active participation of its teachers in research and publication fields.

Located centrally in the district of Gaya, the College is accessible properly and well connected to the city's prime locations such as bus stand, railway station, and airport. The College has well-developed infrastructure in terms of spacious classrooms, central library, laboratories, seminar hall, girls' common room, large office spaces, washrooms, and other required facilities. The new vocational building, designed and constructed under the aegis of Mr. Shabi Arfeen Shamsi, Secretary G.B, is equipped with properly ventilated classrooms having seating capacity of upto 70 each, tutorial classroom, computer labs, conference hall, auditorium, separate washrooms for teachers and students, office room, spacious parking area at the basement, and a guest room.

The institution is known for its plural character. Academic programmes of study have attracted students from diverse socio-religious backgrounds, and teaching and non-teaching positions show great diversity. The Principals of the College have been drawn from the non-minority ranks as well. MGC believes in preserving its constitutionally guaranteed rights and protection and adhering to principles of diversity, plurality and multiculturalism.

Progress is inevitable for any educational institution to keep itself functioning. MGC believes in taking innovative ideas and exploring new pathways of development in its journey of excellence and advancement. Currently, MGC is working on transforming its central library into digital library, moving swiftly towards paperless administrative works, computerization of office and departmental works, and introducing new courses. These initiatives under progress would go a long way to make an effective e-governance mechanism.

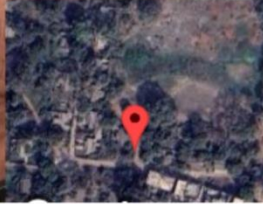
College Library

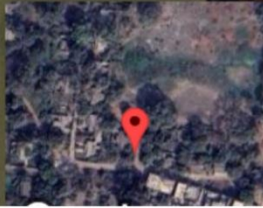
